Dear ARCH Friends -

The ARCH Board feels very privileged to be partnering with Porter once again on this exciting new project. In 2015 ARCH proposed a "Family Center" separate but adjacent to two of the ARCH rooms, to which many of you gave donations. Your generosity will now be realized in a new vision that will exist within the facility that better matches the philosophy of care.

We have, over the past 14 years, approached you with our mission to help our neighbors cope with death and dying. We are deeply grateful for all of your support in this endeavor – your words, deeds and resources have been invaluable in the creation of four end of life suites on the Porter campus. This is a unique accomplishment that places Addison County in a rare position to now further enhance the delivery of end of life care.

We are embarking on this campaign with Porter to build a new space at Helen Porter to better accommodate the needs and wishes of those community members and their families who are unable to be in their homes during this challenging time. We recognize the exceptional palliative and hospice care currently being delivered in the ARCH rooms, but now need the physical environment to better serve the patients and their loved ones. We hope that you will join us once again in envisioning a sanctuary that respects the dying process of each individual and honors the legacies they leave behind.

Addison Respite Care Home (ARCH) is a non-profit which, since 2011, has established end-of-life care rooms within the Helen Porter complex and Porter Medical Center. Our mission is to provide home like end-of-life care for those individuals who are unable to complete their lives at home.

Addison Respite Care Home - ARCH - is a committed group of community members who are dedicated to improving end of life care for our families, friends and neighbors in Addison County, Vermont. The original Founders of ARCH were hospice volunteers who were experiencing the sacred passage of dying in diverse situations throughout this rural area - in homes as well as in facilities (Porter Hospital, Helen Porter Rehabilitation & Nursing, independent care homes). It is widely recognized that many people choose to die at home, in a comfortable, familiar setting, with loved ones nearby. However this is very often not possible for various reasons. So ARCH's mission was developed - to provide end of life care accommodations for those individuals unable to complete their lives at home. In 2011, ARCH partnered with Helen Porter Rehabilitation & Nursing (HPRN) to create the first end of life suite on their Long Term Care Unit. The Middlebury Lions generously supported this unique endeavor with a \$25,000 donation. This room demonstrated a need in the community that prompted the creation--in memory of an ARCH Board member Milo Schaefer-- of a second ARCH room next to the first in 2012. The staff on the Memory Care Unit at HPRN then came to ARCH to see if a room could be designed to respect the special circumstances of their residents. ARCH dedicated this third room, created in 2013, to the thoughtful staff caring for those community members with unique needs. Porter Hospital, with a 25-bed Medical Surgical Unit, experiences many situations where the delivery of quality "person and family centered care" is enhanced by an environment that is private, less medically intrusive and comfortable so that the individual dying process can be honored by all involved. In 2014, an anonymous donor-- personally touched by the significance of a natural, gentle death within a hospital setting--supported ARCH in the design of "The Estuary", the fourth room to provide palliative and hospice care to our community.

ARCH continues with its mission by partnering with other organizations to provide education and options to those preparing for and experiencing end of life issues. The Board is very enthusiastic to partner again with PMC on the design of a new end of life suite at Helen Porter that will provide space essential to holding the dying process with professional and compassionate care.
