First DAISY Award Winner Becci Gordon, RN

On his second day of life, my son stopped eating, earning him a trip to the UVM NICU. The fact that he was able to make this trip in stable condition was due to Becci's expert and attentive care. Becci possesses an intuition to discern between normal irregularities and early red flag warning signs that merit further attention – even when dealing with the added challenge of a non-verbal newborn. As my son progressed from a "textbook eater" to being far more interested in sleeping than eating, to not being able to keep any food in his stomach at all, Becci observed and recorded everything without causing unnecessary stress or anxiety to us. Becci was such a good teacher – she taught me how to care care of myself and take care of my son.

The DAISY Committee met on Tues, July 21st and reviewed the "blinded" nominations and used a point scoring system to determine the winner. The term "blinded" means that the committee did not know the names of the nominees prior to casting their votes—it was only after the votes were counted that the committee learned the names of the nominees. After all of the votes were counted, Becci received 123 points out of 128. DAISY nominations are currently accepted from providers, patients and family members/visitors of patients.
